



This workshop was conducted at Rustomjee School at 3:00 pm on 25th January 2016. The workshop was conducted for 120 children in total, divided into 30 children per class.

Many children fall prey to sexual abuse by adults and sometimes older children. A large number (15-20%) of adults report that children were abused or inappropriately touched. Children from all socioeconomic classes are affected. This experience can leave intense emotional scars on children and affect their development as happy, healthy adults. The SFIMAR students aimed to educate children about safe/good and unsafe/bad touch through this workshop. They also educated children about three parts of their body (chest, bottom, and between legs) that anyone cannot touch. They also taught them to protect themselves if such a thing happens. 


